Classic Room

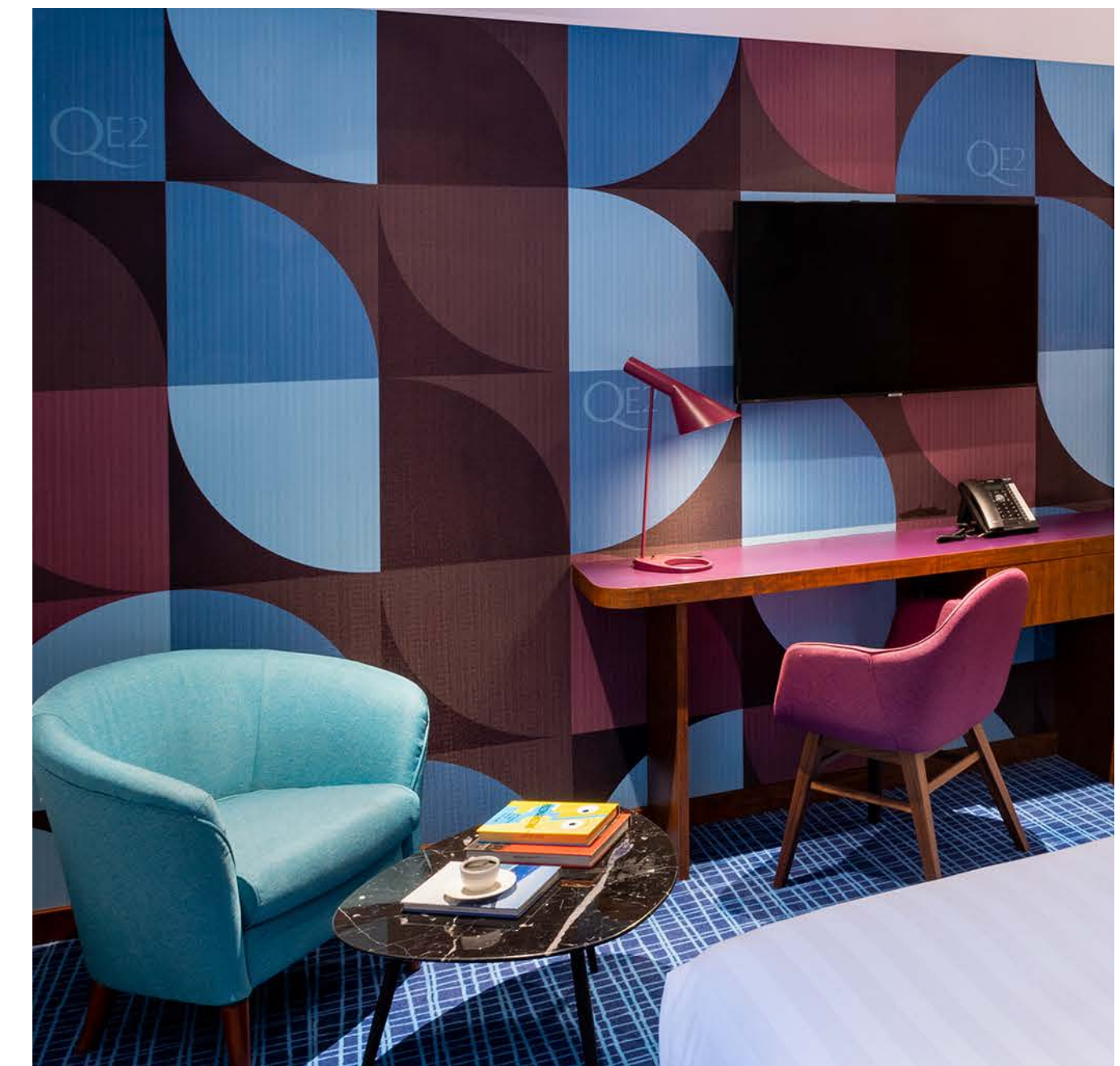
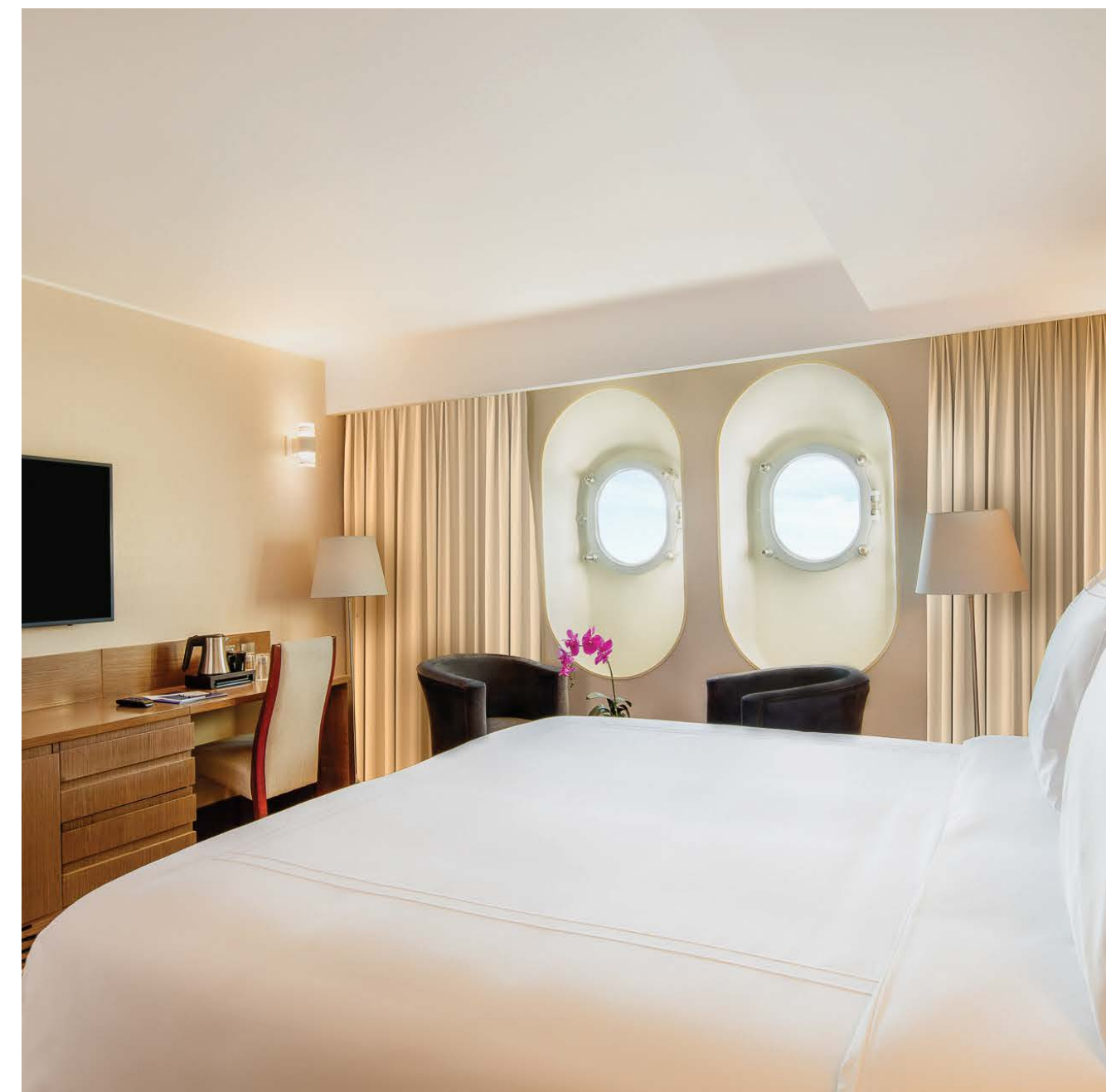

The Royal Suite

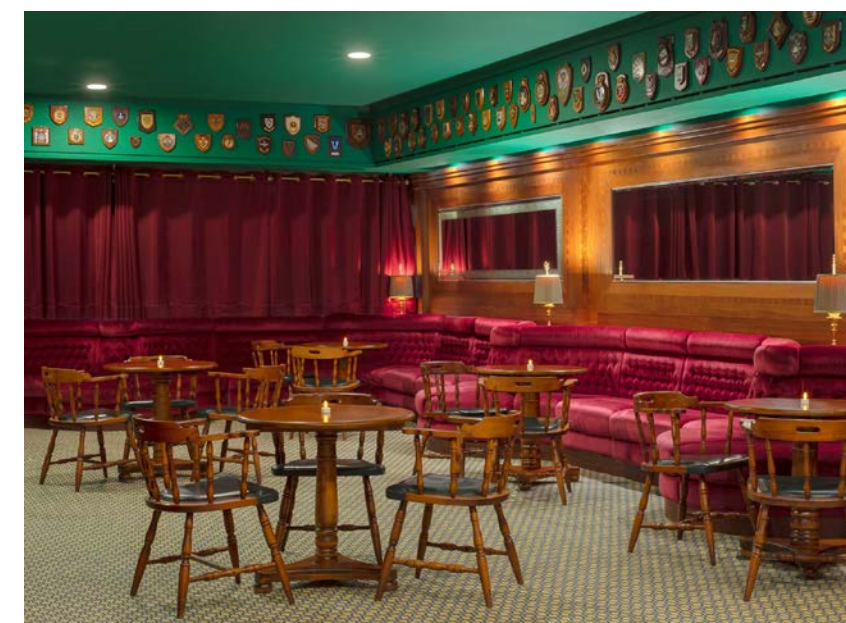

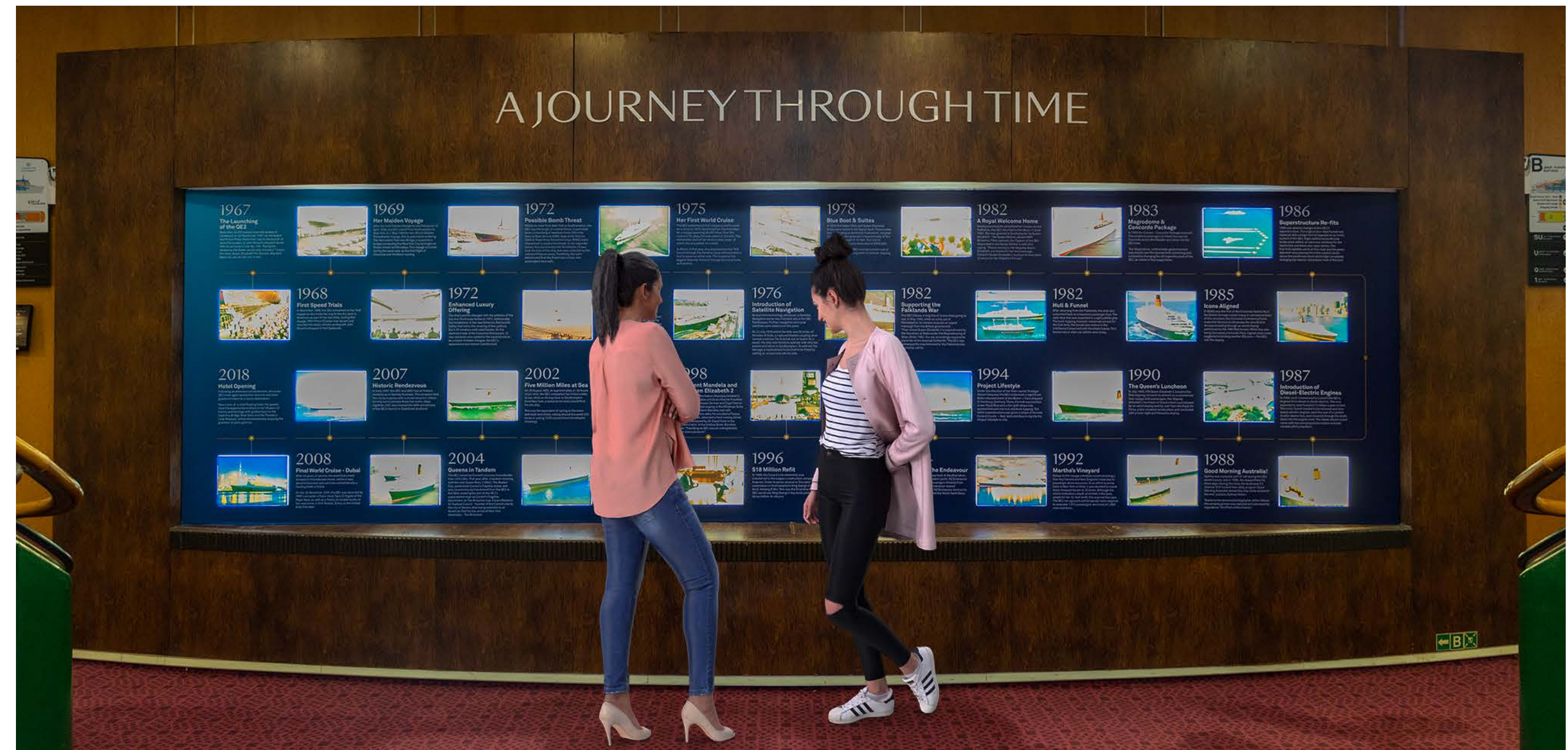

Step Back in Time

Since her launch in 1967, the Queen Elizabeth 2 has had a wonderful life, traveling over 6 million miles across the oceans, the equivalent to circumnavigating the globe 25 times, whilst carrying over 2.5 million passengers in her 39 years of service.



1967

The Launching of the QE2

On 20 September 1967, as the Queen and Prince Philip made their way to the launch of what the builders at John Brown's shipyard would refer to as Cunard Liner No. 736. During the ceremony the Queen would later proclaim "I name this ship, Queen Elizabeth the Second. May God Bless her and all who sail in her."



1969

Her Maiden Voyage

After her brief Maiden Voyage to Las Palmas on 22 April 1969, the QE2 sailed from Southampton to New York on 2 May 1969 for her official Maiden Transatlantic Voyage. This voyage occurred during the same year as the first flight of Concorde and the Moon landing.



1975

Her First World Cruise

The QE2 embarked on her inaugural world cruise on 4 January 1975, departing from Southampton for a voyage spanning 38,000 miles. Over the course of 92 days, the ship called at 23 ports. This marked the start of her world cruise career, of which she completed 25 in total.



1982

Supporting the Falklands War

In May 1982, while on a trip out of Philadelphia, its owners received an urgent message from the British government: "Your vessel Queen Elizabeth 2 is requisitioned by the Secretary of State under the Requisitioning of Ships Order, 1982. You are accordingly required to place her at his disposal forthwith".



1987

Introduction of Diesel-Electric Engines

In 1986, work commenced to convert the QE2's engines from steam to diesel-electric. The iconic funnel needed to be removed and nine diesel-electric engines, each the size of a London double-decker bus, were lowered through the shaft, down into the engine room.



2018

Hotel Opening

Following an extensive refurbishment, the iconic QE2 once again opened her doors to welcome guests on board. Now a one-of-a-kind floating hotel, her guests have the opportunity to share in her 50 years of history and heritage with guided tours to the Captain's Bridge, Boat Deck and the Traveler's Cove Museum.



2008

Final World Cruise

After 40 years of service, the world bid a fond farewell to this beloved vessel, before it was decommissioned and set to be converted into a floating hotel in Dubai. On the 26 November 2008, the QE2 was escorted by HMS Lancaster, a Duke-class Type 23 frigate of the Royal Navy, as well as a flotilla of smaller boats, to her new home in Port Rashid, Dubai, in the United Arab Emirates.



2002

Five Million Miles at Sea

On 29 August 2002, at approximately 21.50 hours ship's time, the QE2 completed five million miles at sea while on its way back to Southampton from New York, a world record and a world first for any ship.



1999

Millennium Cruise

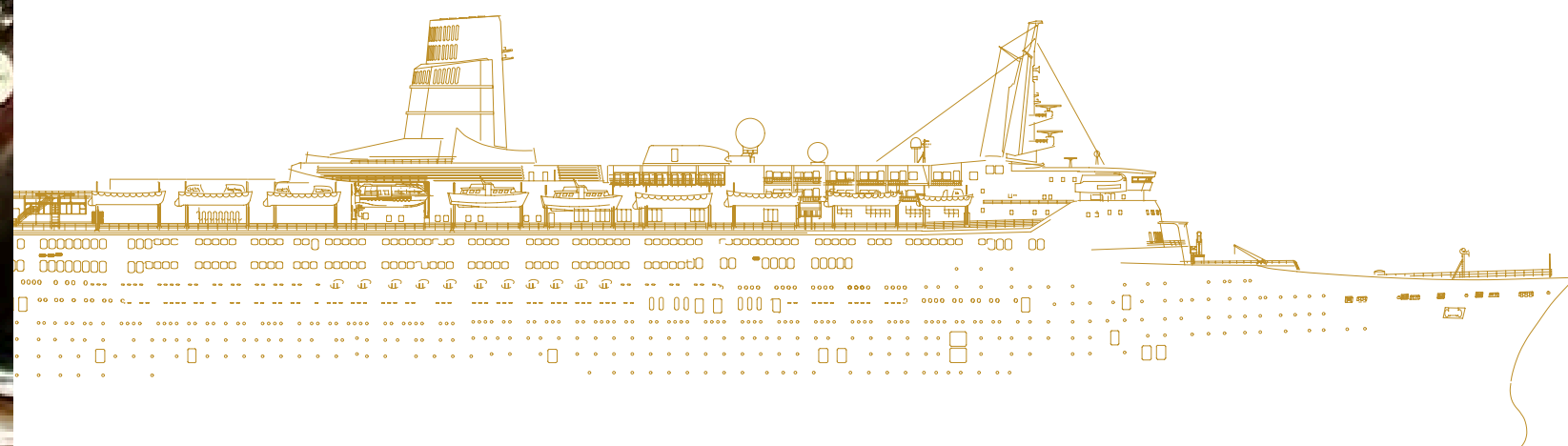
Part of The Millennium Cruise which departed Southampton on December 18, 1999, for a 24-night tour, which took passengers on a round trip to Barbados for New Year's Eve Y2K celebrations. During that trip, the QE2 rendezvoused with The Caronia, who herself was on her first voyage, for combined revelry.



1995

1000th Voyage & 95 ft. Rogue Wave

In September 1995, while on a westbound voyage from Southampton and Cherbourg to New York City, the QE2 encountered Hurricane Luis and during the storm, was struck by a massive 95ft rogue wave, causing significant damage to the vessel's bow.





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
